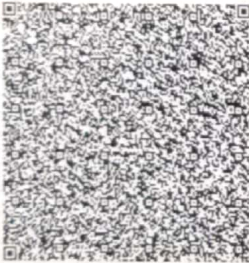

2. That the objectives of the Trust shall be wholly for the public and charitable purposes and incomes shall be applied for the same and accumulated in India wholly for public & charitable purposes without prejudice to generality of provisions aforesaid and the following shall be deemed to be the principal objectives of "Annex Education"

TRUST DEED -

The amount contributed by the founder/settler & Trustees shall and will stand possessed the same upon the trust and also the trustees may from time to time receive for augmenting the trust funds as donations, gifts, interests to capital deposit amount of Rs.1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) etc for the General public and General Purpose of the trust fund of the trust arising from the subscriptions, donations, grants, or otherwise from any sources and also of any investment etc. representing the same, (HEREINAFTER CALLED 'THE TRUSTEE')

Further more the net income from the said trust fund, to apply both the capital and income of the said trust fund for the purpose and betterment of the aims and objects only of the said trust.

TRUST PROPERTIES:

The Trustees shall stand and possessed of the said amount of corpus and such other properties, both moveable and immovable as may be acquired from time to time by the Trust, viz. by purchase, exchange, grants subscriptions, or the endowment donations gifts, contribution or in any manner whatsoever all of which shall be designated 'THE TRUST PROPERTIES' of the Trust herein mentioned above.

EXECUTIVE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

That all the trustees of the said trust shall be called 'THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF TRUSTEES' LIFE MEMBER".

The above mentioned trustees of the said trust shall be called 'THE LIFE MEMBER TRUSTEE'.

FOUNDER MEMBERS:

The above said settler/chairman/founder of this Trust and all the said Trustees i.e., shall be called 'THE FOUNDER OF THE SAID TRUST'

THE MANAGING TRUSTEE:

The Founder Trustees – Mr. Harishchandra Kumar shall be the permanent Managing Trustee of the said trust till his lifetime. After Mr. Harishchandra Kumar their sons/daughters is the remaining trustees for the time being shall elect one of themselves as the Managing Trustee. It shall,

However be opened that the Managing Trustees shall be elected by 2/3rd majority of the said Board of Trustee of the said Trust, in the General Meeting of the Board.

WHO MAY BE APPOINTED AS TRUSTEE:

Any person may be appointed as Trustee or trustees of the said Trust appointed by the majority of 2/3rd of the present Trustees and with the consent of the Settler/Founder/Chairman.

WHO MAY BE APPOINTED AS Members:

Any person may be appointed as member of the said trust by paying annual fees of Rupees One Thousand with the consent the Settler/Founder/Chairman.

THE MINUTES BOOK:-

It shall be kept by the managing trustee Minutes Book is an office book in which the presence of every trustee and all proceedings of the meeting of the Board of trustees shall be recorded in the minutes book and shall be signed by Chairman of the meeting either at the conclusion thereof or at the next meeting when it they shall be confirmed.

BANK ACCOUNT:-

The Trustees shall have to deposit the trust money or any portion thereof in any nationalized Bank, such account can be operated by the signatures of any one Founder and any one trustee of the said trust.

To open any type of bank account (s) weather saving account, current account, fixed or otherwise, in the name of the Trust or institution (s) or programmed (s) run by the Trust with any scheduled banks (s) or post office (s) and to operate by the authorized signatory.

BOOK OF ACCOUNT:-

Proper and regular account of all accounts, receipts and expenditure of the said trust shall be maintained regularly.

AUDIT:-

On 31st day of March of every year General Account shall be taken of all the assets and liabilities of the trust and an income & expenditure account for the whole year and a balance sheet as on 31st day of March shall be passed by the Trustees The accounts of the trust shall be audited annually by a chartered Accountant appointed by the Trustees for the purpose.

DISSOLUTION OF THE TRUST:-

That the above said Trust shall be dissolved at any time by Settler/Founder but no profit shall be used by any trustee or settler of the said Trust. The Trust fund, properties either moveable and immoveable shall be spent only for the welfare of the poor and General public or to other

Trust/society having the similar aims and objects. This Trust shall be IRREVOCABLE for all time after death of Founder/Settler.

Aims Objectives of Trust:

- **Education and employment**

- a. To establish and provide educational centers/schools/institutions for non-formal education, school education, higher education, vocational education/training, computer education, education in engineering, education in business management, education in medical sciences, nursing college etc.
- b. To facilitate self employment by delivering technical and financial services to the women and unemployed youth of the rural and urban areas through cooperation from state/central govt. / govt. bodies.
- c. To establish child labor schools at grass root level, block level, district and state level.
- d. To run courses of different languages.
- e. Organizing and running of adult education centers.
- f. To set up libraries and reading rooms conduct study classes and organize cultural activities.
- g. To encourage the rural/urban/slum people to adopt the latest technology in the field of education.
- h. To create employment opportunities for men/women and youth through vocational training facilities to trace out skilled force of women/youth.
- i. To establish and maintain youth centers/theaters/libraries/reading rooms/information centers, hostels, training and educational institutions for job oriented courses.

 - c. To carry out immunization nutrition for health, medical checkup and blood donation programmes
 - d. To propagate family planning schemes by supporting social programmes like marking of condoms etc.

- i. To conduct various camps i.e. trekking camps, snow skeing, water sports, flying and eco development caps etc.
- j. To organize debates and declamation contest, speech.

All the incomes, earnings, movable / immovable properties of the trust shall be solely utilized and applied towards the promotion of its aims and object only as set forth in the Memorandum of the trust

and no profit, thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividends, bonus, profits or in any other manner whatsoever to the present or past members of the trust or to any person claiming through any one or more of the present or the past members.

No member of the trust shall have any personal claim on any moveable or immovable properties of the trust or make any profits, whatsoever, by virtue of this membership.

3. **AND GENERALLY** to do in all public, charitable purposes for public benefit without any discrimination of Caste, Creed, Color, Gender, Religion, Faith, Race or any Nationality. That in case any of the objects of the Trust are held to be non charitable within the meaning of section 2 (15) of the Indian Trust Act, or any statutory modification (s) thereof, the Trustee (s) shall not carry out such objectives

4. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING POWERS:

1. To manage the properties, assets and funds of the Trust, from time to time, such regulations (not being inconsistent with this deed) as they may think fit for and necessary for the purposes of such management and control or in connection with the execution of any of the subject herein contained or powers hereby vested in them and may rescind or alter any such regulation.
2. To accept donations, contributions, grants, subscription in cash or in kind from any person, company, firm, association, organizations, government, non government or semi government agencies, national or foreign funding agencies, family Trust, or corporate bodies for furtherance and achievement of the objectives of the Trust.
3. To appoint a managing Trustee, when necessary.
4. To review the affairs of the Trust and necessary.
5. To appoint officers and members of staff for the Trust and to prescribe their condition of service.
6. To open and to provide for operating banking accounts.
7. To raise loans with or without security or to invite donation and financial help.
8. To receive the honorarium or salary against his/her services or involvement in any of the project or program run by the Trust, which must be decided by the Board of Trustees and approved by the Chairman / Chairperson.
9. To authorize person (s) to sign or execute documents on behalf of the Trust.

- 10 To grant receipts for aid or donation received.
- 11 To grant Special Power of Attorney to represent the Trustees in connection with any legal or other proceedings.
- 12 To acquire land or building on the lease or way of purchase.
- 13 To compromise, compound or refer to Arbitration all actions, proceedings and disputes relating to Trust property or properties.
- 14 To sell or give on rent/lease or on hire any immovable or moveable property of the Trust for some certain period (s) on such terms and conditions as the Trustees may think fit and proper from time to time.
- 15 To open any type of bank account (s) whether saving account, current account, fixed or otherwise, in the name of the Trust or institution (s) or programme (s) run by the Trust with any scheduled banks (s) or post office (s) and to operate by the authorized signatory or signatories as Board of Trustees shall think fit and proper to authorize any person or persons, unless and until determined otherwise the such bank account(s) shall be opened and operated jointly with signatures of any two members of Board of Trustees. The financial year for the Trust shall be from 1st April to 31st March and the accounts of Trust or institution (s) or programme (s) run by the Trust shall be audited yearly by the auditors b(s) or chartered accountant or a firm of chartered accountants to be appointed by the Board of Trustees and the fee for auditor(s), if paid, shall be a part of outgoing amounts from the Trust Funds.
- 16 To give guarantee of the assets and property of the Trust, including the bank guarantee on behalf of the Trust to corporate bodies, persons, firms, institutions, as Trustees may decide from time to time. The Trustees shall not be personally liable for such guarantees or the securities.
- 17 To gift, lease, and transfer the immovable and moveable properties of the Trust.
- 18 To appoint lawyer, pleaders, advocate to file and defend suit or suits filed for and against the Trust and or in the name of the Trust and also file suits for financial and other disputes or dues with different parties and signed executed such application, petition documents for such proceedings and delegate powers to the officers(s), employee(s), staff(s) and Trustee(s) for such proceedings(s) as required from time to time.
- 19 To appoint new member or members of Board of Trustees by a resolution and to discharge any of the Trustee, who become bankrupt or acts in any manner prejudicial to the interest or objects

of the Trust or is convicted of an offence involving moral turpitude or becomes of unsound mind or is otherwise unfit to continue as Trustee, by resolution passed by simple majority of members present and voting in the meeting of Board of Trustees.

20. To appoint from time to time on such terms and conditions as they may determine a Secretary, Manager, Executive Director, Director(s) and other officer(s) or members(s) of staff for carrying out the activities of the Trust and to remove at any time any such Secretary, Manager, Executive Director, Director(s) and other officer(s) or members(s) of staff.

21. After defraying all necessary expenses incurred in the collection or realization of the income from the Trust ten percent (20%) of the balance of the income shall be kept in a reserve fund to be utilized when, in the opinion of the Board of Trustees, there is any emergency and the remaining income may be utilized for the purpose of the Trust.

22. The Trustees shall invest the Trust fund in government securities, saving certificates, fixed deposits or in any other form of investment authorized under provisions of **INDIAN TRUST ACT - 1882 and INDIAN INCOME TAX ACT, 1961**, as they shall deem expedient.

23. It has further been decided that as and when the Trust is enclosed or dissolved all the funds of the Trust shall be transferred to the other recognized Public Charitable Trust having similar objectives.

24. All questions relating to the management of the Trust or the exercise of the powers vested in the Trust shall be decided at a meeting or, if necessary and expedient, by circulation. Every such question shall be decided by a majority of the Trustees present and voting in any meeting of Board of Trustees or by the circulation, as the case may be and any action or decision of such majority shall be as valid as if it was done or made by the all Trustees. The Founder / Chairman shall have a casting vote.

25. In case of occurrence of any vacancy amongst the Trustees because of death, resignation or incapacity of any Trustee or any other cause, a new Trustee may be appointed to fill the Vacancy.

26. All matters not provided for in this Trust deed but necessary for the administration of the Trust of for giving effect to the objectives of the Trust may by resolution(s) made by the Board of Trustees carried by a special majority of two third of total number of the Trustees.
